POTTS HILL TO ALEXANDRIA TRANSMISSION CABLE PROJECT COMMUNITY NOTIFICATION

Cable jointing at Rawson Road, Greenacre

TransGrid is installing a new underground electricity cable from Potts Hill to Alexandria. The Powering Sydney's Future project will help ensure a safe, reliable and affordable electricity supply for Sydney's CBD and surrounding areas. We thank you for your patience during our work so far. As part of the next stage of the project, work to join sections of the underground cable in the joint bay at **Rawson Road, Greenacre**, will start from **14 December 2020**. Work to join the cables will take up to three weeks to complete, weather permitting. Please refer to the map overleaf for the location of the joint bay.

Work activities

- > Installing temporary fencing and safety barriers around the work site.
- > Trimming trees may be required to create a safe distance from plant and equipment (conducted by a trained arborist).
- > Setting up a temporary canopy with an air conditioning unit over the joint bay (at least 10 metres long and three metres wide).
- > Placing a shipping container, rubbish skip and generator alongside the joint bay.
- > Technicians cutting, clamping together and permanently joining two ends of cable under the canopy.
- > Using a de-watering pump as required in wet weather.
- > Any localised nature strip restoration work that may be necessary.

Work hours

Work will typically be done 7am – 6pm, Monday to Saturday but some steps in cable jointing need to continue until they are completed.

How will the work affect you?

- > Cable jointing occurs only at joint bays, so there will be fewer traffic impacts than trenching.
- > Cable jointing largely involves use of hand tools so is typically less noisy than trenching and excavation, but some low-level noise will be generated at night.
- > A security guard will remain onsite around the clock during cable jointing.
- > There will be a temporary loss of street parking of around 10 metres while work is in progress.
- > Road users may experience short delays in accessing local properties.
- > An alternative route will be provided wherever any diversions or temporary closures of pedestrian and cyclist pathways are required.
- > If we anticipate that your driveway access may be disrupted, we will inform you in advance and discuss arrangements.

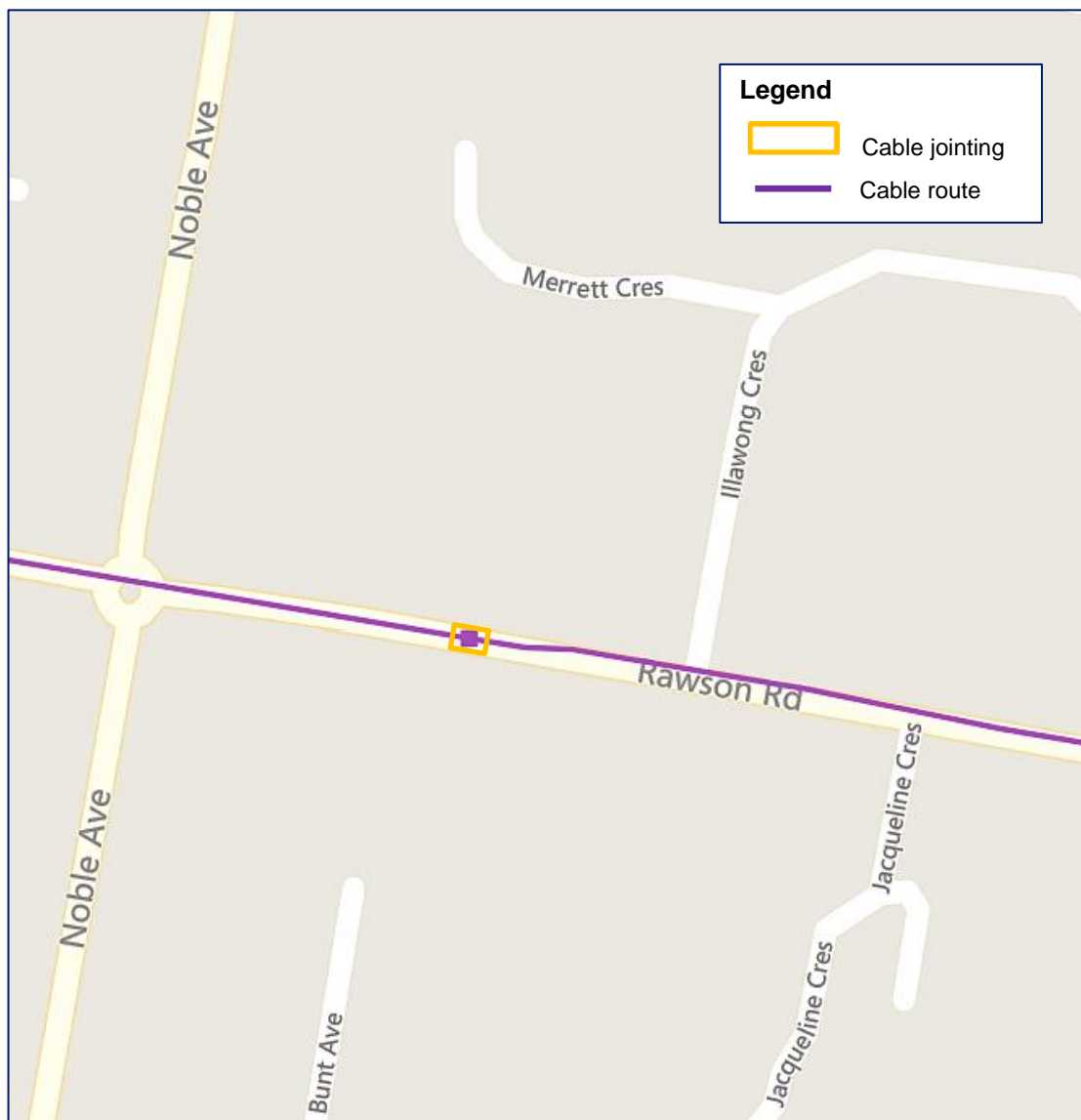
