HumeLink project overview

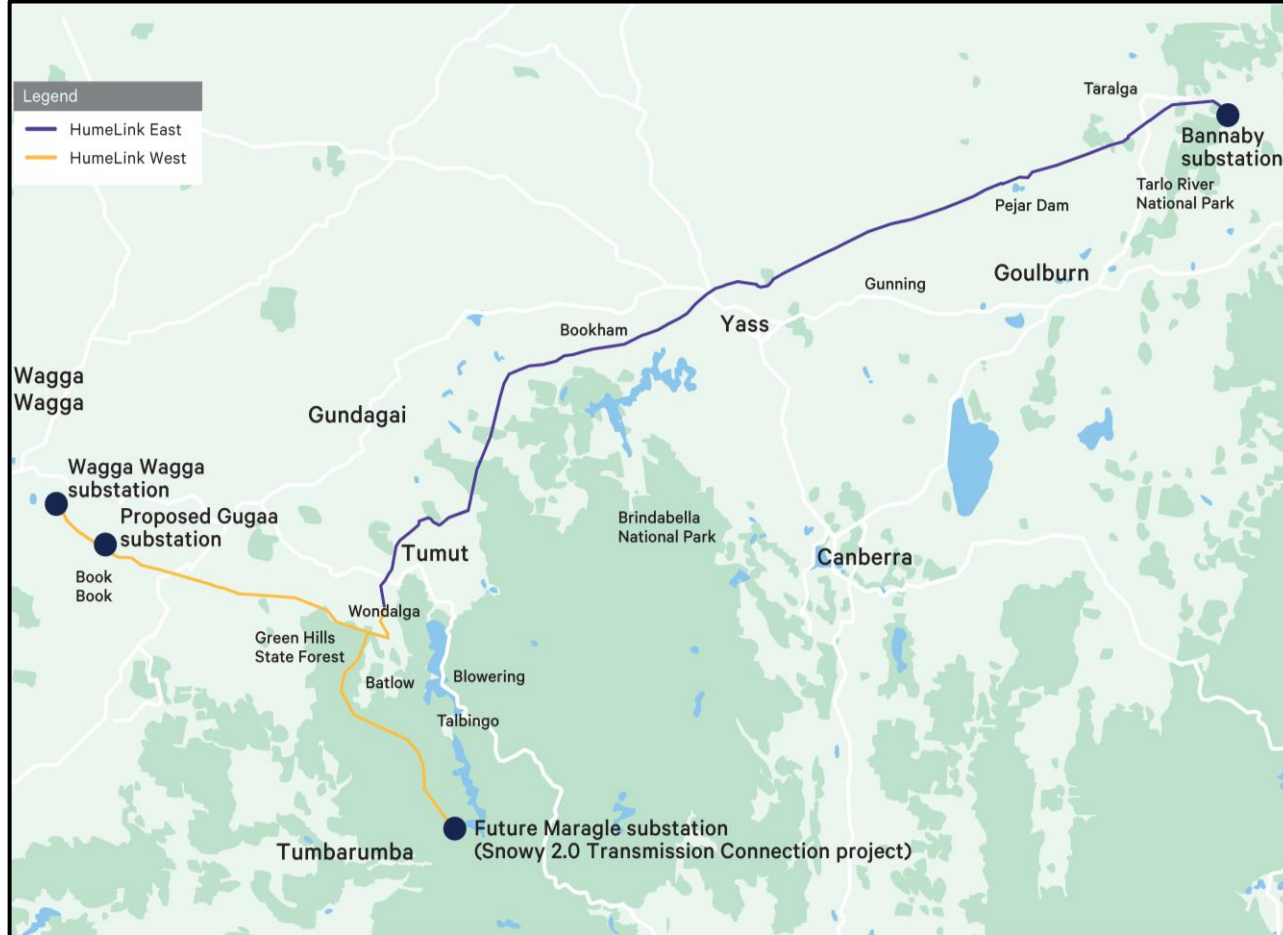
HumeLink is a new 500kV transmission line which will connect Wagga Wagga, Bannaby and Maragle.

HumeLink is one of NSW's largest energy infrastructure projects, with 365km of proposed new transmission lines and new or upgraded infrastructure at four substation locations.

To meet our future energy demands, Australia needs to transition to a greater mix of low-emission renewable energy sources, such as wind and solar. HumeLink will deliver a more reliable and more sustainable grid by increasing the amount of renewable energy that can be delivered across the national electricity grid, helping to transition Australia to a low carbon future.

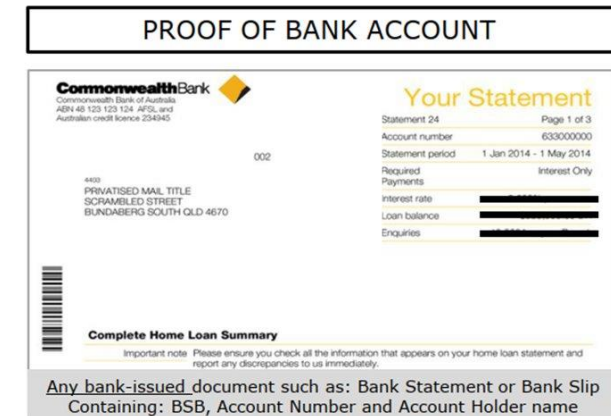
The HumeLink project is divided into two sections (HumeLink East and HumeLink West).

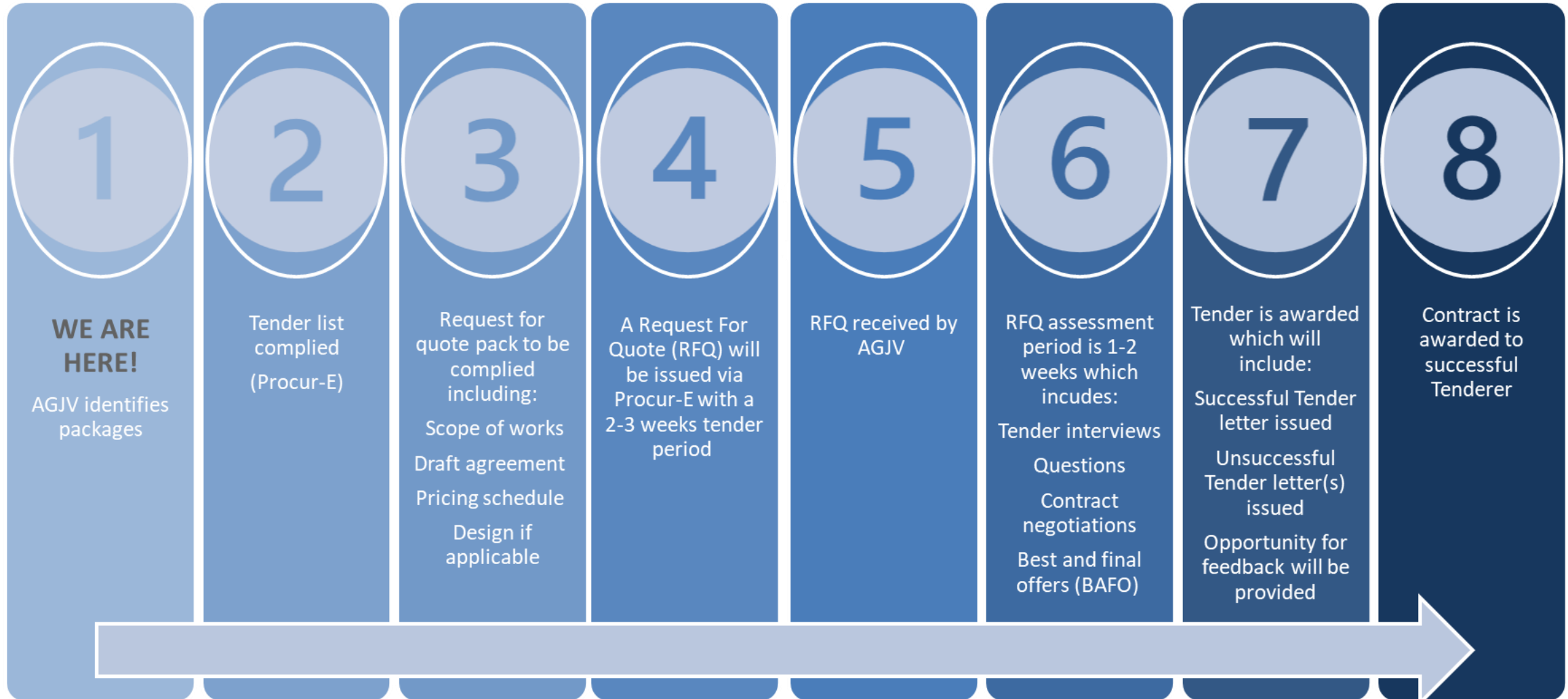

- Mentoring for apprentices and trainees working on the project

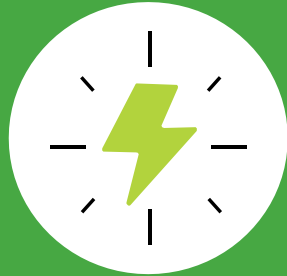
Employment and training opportunities

The HumeLink East project is committed to supporting growth in regional Australia by actively sourcing goods and services from Australian businesses.

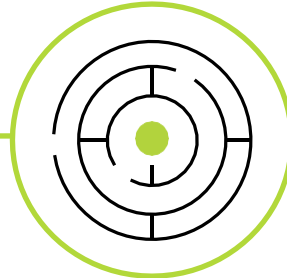
Business opportunities include:
