Assembly is ongoing of two synchronous condensers which sit at the heart of the 16ha Buronga substation. The main connection between NSW, SA and VIC.

The 120MVAR synchronous condensers will play a key role in keeping the grid stable as EnergyConnect unlocks greater renewable energy sharing between the three states.

The 20ha camp is home to more than 200 personnel working on the eastern alignment of Australia's largest transmission project.

In accommodating these facilities, we are minimising the pressure on limited housing markets and local communities, as well as reducing travel to work sites and fatigue.


Transgrid Civil Engineering Scholarship


