Synchronous Condensers arrive at Buronga

We've marked another milestone for Australia's largest electricity project EnergyConnect, with the arrival of two synchronous condensers.

The condensers will sit at the heart of the EnergyConnect project which will allow energy to be shared between NSW, South Australia, and Victoria.

Transgrid Executive General Manager of Major Projects Gordon Taylor said: "These condensers will play a key role keeping the grid stable as we build the energy superhighway to make Australia's transition to renewable energy possible."

October Milestones:

- Lockhart Worker's Camp is occupied with the first employees moving into the 200-bed accommodation facility located on County Boundary Road.
- First line stringing continues around Buronga and to the SA Border.
- Buronga substation – continuing installation of key components of two 120MVar synchronous condensers that will sit at the heart of the project to help maintain voltage on the transmission network and provide system resilience services such as inertia.
- Dinawan - Installation of fencing has commenced at the Dinawan Camp and substation near Bundure (between Coleambally and Jerilderie).
