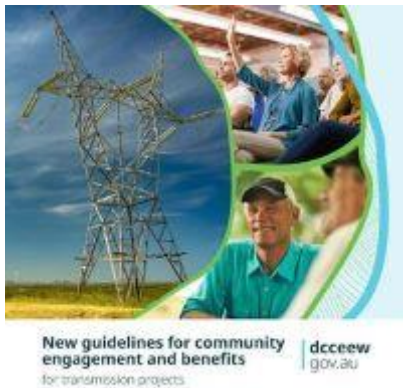
Henty Field Days
