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1. Overview

The TransGrid Advisory Council (TAC) met on Monday 1 March for the first meeting of 2021. The meeting was held over the digital platform WebEx. 4.2 Network Update

TransGrid provided an update to the TAC on the performance of the NSW transmission network across the last quarter.

Head of Network Planning, Andrew Kingsmill, presented on key trends being observed across the network and led a discussion on the current considerations for TransGrid's next Transmission Annual Planning Report.

Included in the discussion was:

- > the continued observation of congestion across the network coinciding with increased generator activity and interest.
 - TAC members were interested in understanding the drivers of the current congestion and the potential impact it may have into the future.
 - Members were interested to understand the impact of various policies including the NSW Energy Infrastructure Strategy on current congestion.
 - Interest was expressed to explore potential opportunities to resolve the issue in the best interests of consumers.
- Currently observed demand drivers including the development of the Aerotropolis in Western Sydney, data centres and Special Activation Precincts in regional NSW.

TAC members were updated on the progress of the Broken Hill Supply RIT-T and the impact of the recently changed AER RIT-T application guidelines.
