Construction update for Old Canterbury Road, Ashfield / Dulwich Hill

Transgrid is installing a new underground electricity cable from Potts Hill to Alexandria. The Powering Sydney's Future project will help ensure a safe, reliable and affordable energy supply for Sydney's CBD and surrounding areas. You can view a map of the cable route at www.transgrid.com.au/psf.

This letter is to let you know that work to restore the road surface on Old Canterbury Road has been delayed by wet weather. We apologise for this delay.

Road restoration work on **Old Canterbury Road** will now start from **7pm on Tuesday 26 October 2021** and will take up to five nights to complete (two nights on, one night off with a maximum of three nights per week). If the weather forecast is poor, work will be rescheduled to the next available night.

As we outlined in our recent letter, the work has to be done at night due to the increased traffic on the road as COVID-19 restrictions have been lifted.

This will be the final stage of work for the project. We thank you for your ongoing patience.

How will the work affect you?

Traffic control will be in place for the safety of workers and road users.

Two-way traffic on Old Canterbury Road will be maintained under stop/slow arrangements.

At times Arlington Street, Prospect Road, Hanks Street, Cobar Street, Elizabeth Avenue, Hugh Avenue will be closed at Old Canterbury Road. Access for residents will be maintained via Queen Street, Hurlstone Avenue, Arlington Street or Dixson Avenue.

The work will be loud at times, but we will make every effort to keep noise to a minimum. The loudest activity will be when the machine grinding the road surface is operating for part of the work period.

There may be temporary closures of footpaths but we will provide an alternative route.

Road users may experience short delays to access local properties.
