POTTS HILL TO ALEXANDRIA TRANSMISSION CABLE PROJECT COMMUNITY NOTIFICATION

Cable installation at Yangoora Road, Lakemba, and Lucerne Street, Belmore

TransGrid is installing a new underground electricity cable from Potts Hill to Alexandria. The Powering Sydney's Future project will help ensure a safe, reliable and affordable electricity supply for Sydney's CBD and surrounding areas. We thank you for your patience during our work so far. As part of the next stage of the project, work to install the underground cable at **Yangoora Road**, **Lakemba**, **and Lucerne Street**, **Belmore**, will start from **Thursday**, **14 January 2021**. Cable installation will take up to three weeks to complete, weather permitting. Please refer to the map overleaf.

Work activities

- > Installing temporary fencing and safety barriers around the work site.
- > Trimming trees may be required to create a safe distance from plant and equipment (conducted by a trained arborist).
- > Pulling electricity cable through underground pipes at joint bays in the road.
- > Excavating a small pit (six metres long by three metres wide) to install cable pulling equipment, between each joint bay at **Neale Street**.
- > Using a de-watering pump/vacuum truck as required in wet weather.
- > Any localised nature strip restoration work that may be necessary.

Work hours

Standard working hours are 7am - 6pm, Monday to Friday and from 8am to 1pm on Saturday.

How will the work affect you?

- > Yangoora Road will be temporarily closed to through traffic between Wangee Road and Garrong Road during work hours. Yangoora Road will remain open to local residents.
- > Lucerne Street will be temporarily closed to through traffic between Neale Street and Knox Street during work hours.. Lucerne Street will remain open to local residents.
- > The cable drum truck is around 4.5 metres wide when stationary and six metres wide when in use. The truck will arrive before the morning peak time and turn off its engine until 7am. It will leave after cable installation has ended each day.
- > Traffic detours and traffic control will be in place for the safety of workers and road users
- > The work will be noisy at times, including a generator operating at each cable pulling pit, but we will make every effort to minimise noise.
- > There will be a temporary loss of street parking while work is in progress.
- > An alternative route will be provided wherever any diversions or temporary closures of pedestrian and cyclist pathways are required.
- > Residents and businesses may experience short delays in accessing properties. Driveway access will be maintained where possible. If we anticipate that your access is going to be disrupted for an extended period, we will inform you in advance and discuss alternative arrangements.
