POTTS HILL TO ALEXANDRIA TRANSMISSION CABLE PROJECT COMMUNITY NOTIFICATION

Work update for May Street, Princes Highway and Sydney Park carpark, St Peters

TransGrid is installing a new underground electricity cable from Potts Hill to Alexandria. The Powering Sydney's Future project will help ensure a safe, reliable and affordable electricity supply for Sydney's CBD and surrounding areas. Further to our letter issued on 7 May 2021, we are writing to let you know that trenching work on May Street is nearly complete and construction on Princes Highway is about to begin. Please refer to pages three and four of this letter for upcoming traffic changes in the area.

Summary of upcoming work

Cumilary of upcoming work	
May Street	Our crews continue to progress in an easterly direction towards Princes Highway and we expect to complete work on May Street by Tuesday 15 June , weather and ground conditions permitting. May Lane will be closed at its intersection with May Street from Thursday 3 June until May Street work is complete.
	Our work hours will continue to be 6pm Sunday through to 6pm Friday (on a 24 hour day and night basis) and 8am to 6pm Saturday.
Princes Highway and Sydney Park carpark	From Sunday evening 6 June , investigation work will start on Princes Highway. This work is needed to prepare for construction and will take about three nights to complete and will be carried out at night from 7pm to 6am.
	From Tuesday evening 15 June , we will start trenching across Princes Highway. Trenching across the Princes Highway is expected to take up to three weeks to complete.
	Trenching will be carried out five nights per week (Sunday night to Thursday night) from 7pm to 6am. Where possible, we will endeavour to complete high noise activities, such as concrete sawing and rock hammering, before midnight.

There will be no construction work over the long weekend from 6pm Friday 11 June to 7am Tuesday 15 June and we will minimise the traffic changes and parking restrictions in the area as much as possible during this period.

Work activities

- > Delivering plant and equipment to site.
- > Trimming trees to create a safe distance from plant and equipment (directed by a qualified arborist).
- > Cutting the road surface with a concrete saw.
- > Digging a trench about two metres wide using an excavator.
- > Installing conduits (pipes).
- > Using a pump/vacuum truck to remove water as required.
- > Backfilling the trench and covering it with steel plates.
- > Restoring concrete road pavement, including pouring concrete.
- > Temporarily restoring the road surface to allow normal traffic flow and the footpath and grass verge as required.

How will the work affect you?

- > The work will be noisy at times, but there are a number of ways we will be working to minimise disruption:
 - High noise activities, such as concrete sawing and rock hammering, will be completed before **midnight** where possible. Please note that an excavator will be operating on site overnight.
 - Noise monitoring will be done regularly during the work.
- > Road users may experience temporary delays to access local properties.
- > An alternative route will be provided wherever any diversions or closures of pedestrian pathways are required.
- > If we anticipate that your driveway access may be disrupted, we will inform you in advance and discuss arrangements.

What's next

When trenching is finished, we will temporarily restore the road surface to allow normal traffic flow, and restore the footpath and grass verge as required.

The next stage of work will involve installing two joint bays in Camdenville Park. Once the joint bays have been installed, we will install cables and join sections of cable together. There will also be some work in the Sydney Park car park (off Princes Highway and Barwon Park Road) to assist with feeding the cables through the soon to be installed conduits. We will keep you advised of these activities.

Once all work is complete in the area and the cable is installed and tested, we will permanently restore the road surface.

The health and safety of our people, customers and the community and ensuring a reliable supply of electricity to NSW and the ACT are our highest priorities during the COVID-19 crisis.



Traffic changes until Tuesday 15 June (day and night work)


- > From Thursday 3 June, May Lane will be closed at its intersection with May Street. The closure will be in place day and night, and access to May Lane will be via Goodsell Street, Council Street and Caroline Lane.
- > May Street will continue to be closed to eastbound traffic at the intersection with Campbell Street. Access for westbound traffic will maintained between Princes Highway and Campbell Street.
- > Two-way traffic will be maintained on Princes Highway under traffic control during investigation night work from Sunday 6 June for approximately three nights.
- > Some parking restrictions will be in place on May Street and Princes Highway.



There will be no construction work over the long weekend from 6pm Friday 11 June to 7am Tuesday 15 June and we will minimise the traffic changes and parking restrictions in the area as much as possible during this period.

Traffic changes from Tuesday 15 June (7pm to 6am for night work)

- > Two-way traffic will be maintained on Princes Highway under traffic control.
- > May Street will be closed to westbound traffic at the intersection with the Princes Highway.
- > Access to May Street will be via Campbell Street or Goodsell Street as shown on the map below. Detour signage and traffic control will be in place to assist local residents.
- > Some street parking on Princes Highway and May Street will be temporarily removed during the work (day and night).
