POTTS HILL TO ALEXANDRIA TRANSMISSION CABLE PROJECT COMMUNITY NOTIFICATION

Upcoming work on Addison Road and Illawarra Road, Marrickville

TransGrid is installing a new underground electricity cable from Potts Hill to Alexandria. The Powering Sydney's Future project will help ensure a safe, reliable and affordable electricity supply for Sydney's CBD and surrounding areas. Thank you for your patience while we work to complete the first stage of work on Addison Road between Illawarra Road and Denby Street.

This letter is to provide you with information about the next stage of work on **Addison Road and Illawarra Road**. Starting from **Tuesday 18 May 2021**, there will be four sections of work delivered in this next stage:

This work will involve extensive 24/7 traffic and parking changes, including temporary detours that are different to the detours that have been in place so far. These changes are detailed overleaf.

Night work activity has potential to be noisy at times. However, there are a number of ways we will be working to minimise disruption:

- High noise activities such as concrete sawing and rock hammering will be completed before midnight where possible.
- We will do regular noise monitoring while work is in progress to ensure noise is within the levels allowed for this work.

Work activities

- > Installing temporary fencing and safety barriers.
- > Delivering plant and equipment to site.
- > Trimming trees to create a safe distance from plant and equipment (directed by a trained arborist).
- > Cutting the road surface with a concrete saw.
- > Digging a trench about two metres wide using an excavator and installing conduits (pipes).
- > Completing a short bed bore under other utility services in Illawarra Road.
- > Excavating ancillary and cable pulling pits either in the road, footpath or grass verge.
- > Installing precast concrete sections in the pit to form the floor and walls of the ancillary and cable pulling pits.
- > Using a pump/vacuum truck as required, particularly in wet weather.
- > Backfilling the trench and covering it with steel plates.
- > Restoring the road surface to allow normal traffic flow as required.

Traffic changes

From **Tuesday 18 May**, we will introduce new traffic changes both at the work zone and on nearby local streets to ensure traffic can continue moving through the area. The specific changes are:



Addison Road	Traffic detour	Addison Road will remain open for motorists travelling east (i.e. from Illawarra Road to Enmore Road) at all times. Addison Road will be closed for westbound traffic during work hours and detours will be in place on Addison Road travelling from Enmore Road to Illawarra Road. Motorists will need to detour via Victoria Road, Chapel Street and Shepherd Street. Addison Road will be open to westbound traffic from 3pm to 7pm Monday to Friday, and from 6pm Saturday to 6am Monday.	
	Parking	Parking restrictions in place will continue, and additional street parking will be removed (please refer to the map on page 3).	
Agar Street	Temporary closure	There will be no traffic access to or from Addison Road at the intersection of Agar Street.	
Chapel Street Parking		Parking restrictions in place will continue, as this will enable two-way traffic flow as part of detours during construction.	
Cook Road Traffic change		A right turn only from Cook Road into Addison Road will be in place when Addison Road is closed to westbound traffic.	
		A right turn only from Cook Road into Addison Road will be in place when Addison Road is closed to westbound traffic.	
Fotheringham Lane	Temporary closure	There will be no traffic access to or from Addison Road at the intersection of Fotheringham Lane during night work.	
	Traffic detour	Illawarra Road will be closed to through traffic between Chapel Street and Addison Road. Traffic will detour via Chapel Street - Shepherd Street - Addison Road. There will be no access between Illawarra Road and Addison Road.	
Illawarra Road	Resident / business access	Resident and business only access to Illawarra Road is via the intersection of Illawarra Road and Chapel Street.	
	Parking	Street parking will be removed from sections of Illawarra Road (please refer to the map on page 3).	
Philpott Street	Temporary closure	There will be no traffic access to or from Addison Road at the intersection of Philpott Street.	
Shepherd Street	Parking	Parking restrictions in place will continue, as this will enable two-way traffic flow as part of detours during construction.	


Road users may experience short delays to access local properties. If we expect your driveway access will be disrupted, we will inform you in advance and discuss arrangements.

There will be temporary closures of footpaths, but we will provide an alternative route for pedestrians.


Please follow detour signage, temporary parking restrictions and guidance from traffic controllers to help maintain safety for workers, motorists and the community.

Right turn only from Denby Street and Cook Road onto Addison Road when Addison Road westbound detour is in place.

NOTE: Addison Road will be open to traffic in both directions from 3pm to 7pm Monday to Friday, and from 6pm Saturday to 6am Monday.

What's next

We expect to be working in this area until July 2021 and we will continue to keep you informed about each stage of work and what to expect. We thank you for your patience and cooperation. The next stages of work include:

Cable pulling

After the conduits, joint bays and ancillary pits are installed, the construction team return to install cable. Temporary traffic changes may be required during this work, which currently expected to take place in June 2021.

Joining cable sections

After the cables are installed in the conduits, the next step is to join the sections of cable together. This work will be done inside the joint bays under a canopy. This work is being planned for July 2021, and will take about two to three weeks to complete.
